

LOOKING BACK ON THIS YEAR'S STARLIGHT WAI



On Saturday 5th July, over 1,100 walkers turned the streets of Huddersfield neon pink as they walked under starlit skies, raising £133,500 for The Kirkwood!

On a warm and breezy West Yorkshire evening, walkers descended on the Accu Stadium in Huddersfield to revel in the unique atmosphere and take on a late night walk like no other.

Supporters came from across Kirklees to join The Kirkwood Starlight Walk, our biggest fundraising night of the year. Families, friends and colleagues joined forces to take on a three, six or ten mile challenge in support of patients and families in our care.



Formerly known as The Kirkwood Memory Walk, our event is a beacon of hope for our supporters, bringing people together to celebrate the enduring power of love and walk in memory of the amazing people who brightened up their lives.

The funds our walkers raise help to support specialist care for patients and families affected by life limiting illnesses across Kirklees.

For many families, The Starlight Walk was a chance to reunite and to do something amazing together in memory of someone special.

It was a poignant night for 66-yearold Andrew, from Linthwaite, whose family has dedicated itself to fundraising for The Kirkwood in memory of his late wife.

Andrew said: "I'm walking tonight in memory of my wife, Elizabeth, who passed away on the 1st of January this year.



"She had cancer and was admitted to The Kirkwood on the 30th of December. She was only there for 48 hours, but the care and attention she received was absolutely second to none. They've helped me a lot too.

"My daughter's supporting the hospice through her business, and we've all been doing our bit. My son has even come back from Gibraltar to do the walk with me. In total, between us, we've raised around £1,300 so far and we're not done yet.

"The Kirkwood means the world to me now. They were there for my wife, for me, and now for my whole family. Supporting them feels like the least I can do."

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"THE KIRKWOOD GAVE ME BACK MY LIFE!"

At 62, Gary was diagnosed with incurable COPD. He had lost weight, hope, and the strength to carry on. However, with the care and support of The Kirkwood's dedicated team, Gary has rebuilt his confidence and has learnt to breathe again.

eflecting on his experience with a life limiting illness, Gary said, "I had reached my limit. I was exhausted and thought that this was it. I couldn't see a way forward. I felt like I was being passed between hospitals, facing what seemed like a death sentence."

Gary was placed on end of life care and referred to The Kirkwood. Like many others, he believed that hospice was synonymous with the end of life: "I thought it was just where you went to die. I didn't know what to expect, but I didn't expect to get my life back."

From the moment he arrived, everything changed. The Kirkwood provided not only medical support but also understanding, time, and compassion: "They didn't just treat my illness; they treated me. Everyone – nurses, doctors, and volunteers – made me feel like I mattered. They gave me time when no one else would."

With patience and care, the team assisted him in breathing more easily, eating better, and regaining some strength. With simple acts, such as helping him take a few

steps, finding manageable food options, and allowing him the space to talk, Gary began to restore what his illness had taken away.

"I started eating again. I gained weight, my breathing improved, and slowly, I began to believe in myself again."

The transformation wasn't instant, but it was profound. After being housebound and feeling hopeless, Gary began by walking short distances. Gradually, he increased his walks and started engaging in activities once more.

"They gave me the confidence to live again. I'm not just existing, I'm

living. They gave me back everything I thought I'd lost: my strength, my dignity, my hope. They saved my life."

Today, Gary is not cured, but he is thriving. The Kirkwood team has helped him to live the best quality of life possible, even while facing illness. Once convinced his story was coming to an end, he now writes new chapters filled with purpose, laughter, and deep gratitude.

"The Kirkwood changed everything. I went in ready to die. But they helped me to breathe again in every sense."



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A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A NURSE

At just 22 years old, Amy has already discovered her calling in one of healthcare's most meaningful, and often misunderstood, fields: hospice care.

my began her journey with The Kirkwood at 19, when she joined the team as a student nurse on a nine-week placement.

"As soon as I started, I knew this was where I wanted to be," Amy says. "I began as a Bank Auxiliary Nurse for a year and a half, then stepped into my role as a Registered Staff Nurse in September 2024. Becoming a palliative care nurse was never part of my plan, but the patient-centred care and support I witnessed here made me fall in love with the work."

A typical shift for Amy starts at 7am with a handover from the night team, before she goes straight to check on her patients. From adjusting pain relief, to simply sharing a quiet moment, no two days are the same.

"On sunny days, one of my favourite things is helping patients get outside into our garden," Amy explains. "Even if someone is restricted to their bed, we can wheel the bed out so they have the chance to feel the sun on their face." During her 13-hour shifts, Amy works alongside a whole team of professionals; doctors, social workers, physiotherapists, occupational therapists and counsellors, all focused on providing compassionate, patientcentred care.

One thing Amy wishes more people knew is that hospice care isn't just for the very end of life: "Care can begin months earlier, giving patients and families more support with pain management, emotional wellbeing, and practical help at home. Families often tell us they wish they had come to hospice sooner."

Like many in her field, Amy has learned to balance the emotional challenges of her role. "I look after my own wellbeing by spending time with friends and family, and I love reading. Books help me step outside of my own thoughts on difficult days."

For Amy, the rewards far outweigh the challenges. "It's a privilege to bring comfort, dignity and meaning



to patients and families at such an important time. Of course there are sad moments, but hospice care is also about connection, joy and making every day count."

Working in palliative care has even shaped Amy's own outlook on life: "It's taught me to cherish the present, because life is so unpredictable. It's given me a new perspective on what really matters."

Much of the care The Kirkwood provides is only possible thanks to charitable donations and gifts in Wills. For Amy, their impact is clear: "They allow us to provide the very best care – not only for those on our In-Patient Unit, but also for patients at home across Kirklees.

"That generosity ensures we can continue to support families when they need us most."

MARK & CAROLINE'S STORY

hen Mark Priestley's wife, Caroline, was diagnosed with a life limiting condition, their lives changed overnight. As Caroline's condition worsened, The Kirkwood became a vital lifeline, offering care and emotional support for Caroline and her family. In this story, Mark shares their journey, the impact The Kirkwood had on their final weeks together, and why he's now committed to supporting the hospice that helped his family through the most difficult time of their lives.

From the moment Caroline was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, their family's world was turned upside down. Within two hours, they began asking themselves, 'OK, what's the plan?' They had always faced challenges as a team, but sadly, Caroline's illness progressed quickly. Mark explains: "She went through two rounds of chemotherapy but then contracted an infection that developed into sepsis. By the time we got that under control, the cancer had reached stage four. We both knew we couldn't fix it. Her pain was getting worse, and I couldn't help her with that."

Help for her pain came from The Kirkwood: "The nursing staff came out to see us, and literally that same day, a bed became available. From the moment we got through the door, it was different. Caroline was immediately seen by a doctor, and she got some proper pain relief. It was a massive relief, not just for her, but for me too. She was finally comfortable."

For Mark, the difference between hospital and hospice care was noticeable: "The care and attention we got from the staff at The Kirkwood was completely different. What struck me was that it wasn't just the patient that was looked after, it was family and friends as well, helping all of us to come to terms with the situation."

Caroline died "peacefully and with dignity" 26 days later.
The impact of those final days remained with Mark. He received pre-bereavement support: "I started seeing Sarah, one of the counsellors here. I didn't want to be the stereotypical Yorkshire bloke who says, 'I'm fine, I don't need it.' It helped. I've learned not to bottle things up."

Now, Mark is determined to give back to The Kirkwood. He believes that "Everyone should have the right to die peacefully and with dignity.

"The Kirkwood makes that possible." Looking back, he remembers Caroline not with sorrow, but with deep love and affection: "Her strength of character to face her final challenge and never complain is something I cannot even comprehend. I couldn't be more grateful for the help The Kirkwood have given me and Caroline."

ur charity shops play a vital role in their communities, serving not only as an outlet for pre-loved clothing but also as a welcoming hub where customers can feel comfortable in their own skin and cultivate friendships. At The Kirkwood, we believe everyone deserves the very best care, irrespective of their background or identity, and we extend that same commitment to our retail shops.

Have you ever walked into a clothing shop and felt out of place? We know stepping through the door of a new shop can sometimes feel intimidating. We want to change that. That's why we are proud to present Fashion Without Boundaries, a brand new retail concept offering a unique shopping experience where everyone feels welcome.

Located just across the road from the Town Hall on Ramsden Street in Huddersfield, Fashion Without Boundaries is The Kirkwood's first shop to organise and display its clothes by style and size rather than by gender. The shop offers a wide range of products and styles to suit different tastes, accommodating all body types. This approach creates a truly inclusive shopping experience, removing conventional boundaries and cultivating a space where visitors can find something they love and feel comfortable in helping everyone to express their personal style.

A Welcoming Space

From the moment you walk through the door, Fashion Without Boundaries feels bright and airy. The white walls, railings, and fixtures allow the clothing to be the star of the show, standing out proudly. This neutral colour scheme is complemented by the warmth of wooden hangers, creating a comfortable and inviting atmosphere. The shop also features a large, accessible changing room, spacious enough for wheelchair users and parents with prams to access with their children.

We asked Louise, the cover manager at Fashion Without Boundaries, 'What makes this shop so popular?' She told us that customers of all ages and backgrounds have become regular visitors to the shop, sharing that they always feel welcome and free to explore all the fashion options available instead of being confined to dedicated, size and gender specific rails.

Louise particularly enjoys meeting and interacting with the diverse range of customers and volunteers who pop in: "We have people from all different communities who appreciate and understand the concept of the shop." she explains. "Our volunteers come from all kinds of backgrounds, and we have a great mix of different ages too. They are all lovely with our customers, and most importantly, they understand The Kirkwood and our commitment to helping those living with life limiting illnesses."

Volunteers Who Love Their Work

The volunteers at our Fashion Without Boundaries shop range from 13 to 80 years old. During our visit we met Baxter, a lovely and chatty volunteer. Eight months ago, Baxter, who is also known as 'Titch' to his friends, was walking past the shop and popped in to have a browse. After striking up a conversation with our team, he discovered there were volunteering opportunities available. He's been a familiar face ever since, greeting new and returning customers with a warm welcome. "I love working here." Baxter exclaims.

One of the things that makes this shop unique is that the team loves to have fun with fashion. Louise shares: "When I'm looking at styles and clothes, I sometimes look and think 'that wouldn't fit my figure,' but at work, our volunteers and customers get involved and cheer you on, giving you the confidence to just go for it! It's a great atmosphere."

PAM'S STORY

am Chapman, from Fixby, has cared for her husband Robert through a long and heart breaking journey with Alzheimer's disease. Drawing strength from her nursing background and the support of The Kirkwood.

In 2013, after Pam retired, she began to notice small but worrying changes in Robert's behaviour. "He was forgetting where things went. I cooked and he washed up, but suddenly everything was going in the wrong cupboards. It was the little things at first, but it added up."

By 2015, it became clear something more serious was happening. After returning from a short holiday in the Netherlands, Pam listened to a series of voicemail messages Robert had left. "They sounded like he was talking to a receptionist. That's when I knew it wasn't just forgetfulness."

After a long process of referrals, tests and psychiatric assessment,

on 6th January 2016, they received a diagnosis: Alzheimer's disease. "The psychiatrist said, 'Go off and enjoy your life.' At the time, I thought it was a strange thing to say. But now I understand, she knew what was coming."

Over the next few years, Robert's condition steadily worsened. In 2018, his psychiatrist advised him to stop driving.

Despite the challenges, Pam still wanted to make memories.

By 2020, Robert had been hospitalised with pneumonia but made a partial recovery. However, in 2022, his condition deteriorated significantly. He became bedbound, non-verbal, and completely dependent on care.

Despite her nursing experience, Pam found herself emotionally overwhelmed. One of the most painful moments came when Robert no longer recognised her. "He asked me who I was. I said, 'I'm your wife.' I went and got our marriage certificate to show him, but he didn't seem to believe it."

The turning point came when Pam was referred to The Kirkwood by a senior nurse, after Robert had become bedbound. Pam was initially hesitant, not knowing what to expect.

"Because I was a nurse, I only saw the clinical side. However I did understand it was more than just a place where people come to die. The Kirkwood's community Admiral Nurse explained the different services the hospice could provide."

Catherine, a Nurse from The Kirkwood began regular visits to Robert and Pam's home: "She was wonderful. She would kneel down and talk to Robert at his level, not over him. She gave me helpful advice about medication and care. I felt listened to."

Pam also learned she could access 24/7 support from The Kirkwood team, even outside office hours: "That gave me such peace of mind."

Catherine continued to call Pam every two to four weeks, just to check in: "That phone call means a lot. It reminds you that someone is still looking out for you."

Pam's story is a powerful reminder that behind every diagnosis is a family doing their best. With the right support, no one should have to face the journey alone.
